Finding Hope One Step at a Time

Angela was a young, spirited 18 year old when she set out on her own to make her way in the world, but it wasn't as easy as she dreamed it would be. When the enticing offer came, exotic dancing sounded lucrative, simple and harmless, and the easiest way to save for her real future. She was **assured many times that she could leave it behind whenever she decided** – so, Angela accepted the job in an industry she didn't fully understand. Quickly she found herself trapped in a web of manipulation, abuse and control, but by then she was **skillfully cut off from family and friends who could help.**


Surviving, just barely, in this dehumanizing nightmare for years –**Angela felt painfully ashamed** that she had lost everything, and even her body was not her own. She felt **hopeless** she could ever regain her freedom. **Silenced, afraid and isolated...** until a new friend faithfully began pursuing her, urging her to grab hold of a path to freedom with Scarlet Road. When her son was born her determination to escape re-ignited. Angela listened to the advice of her friend and **she bravely took her first steps to freedom with Scarlet Road.** Embracing her story and survivor's strength, a team of mentors and case managers brought trauma-informed care, services and resources to her aid. As she slowly worked her personalized plan for recovery, her life was transformed. **Today Angela has safe housing, and has begun her journey of finding her dreams again.** She is pursuing a career in social work and one day hopes to support other women leaving the life.









2017 FINANCIAL DATA




FUNDING SOURCES
